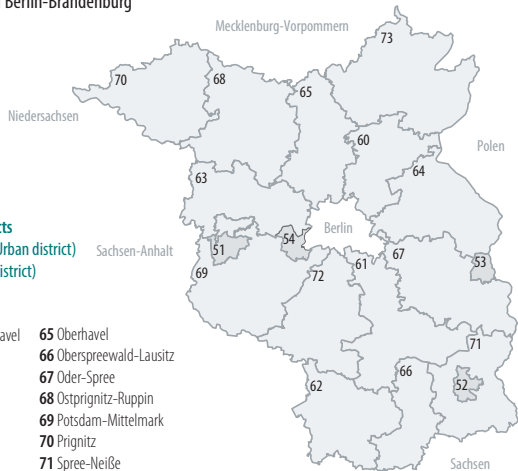

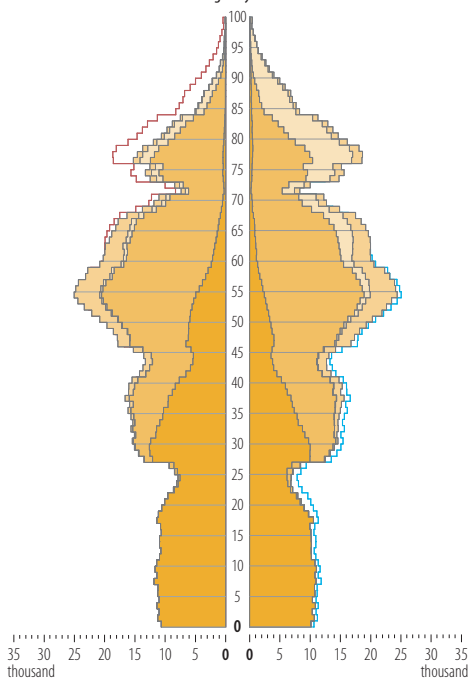

by age and marital status

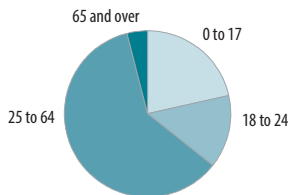

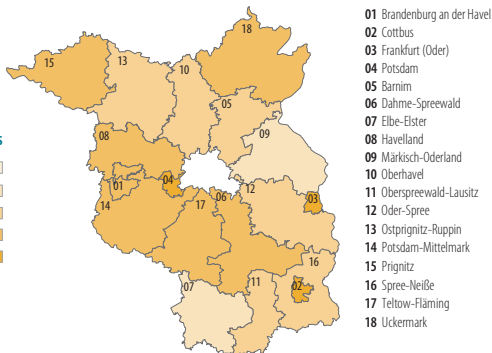

by age groups



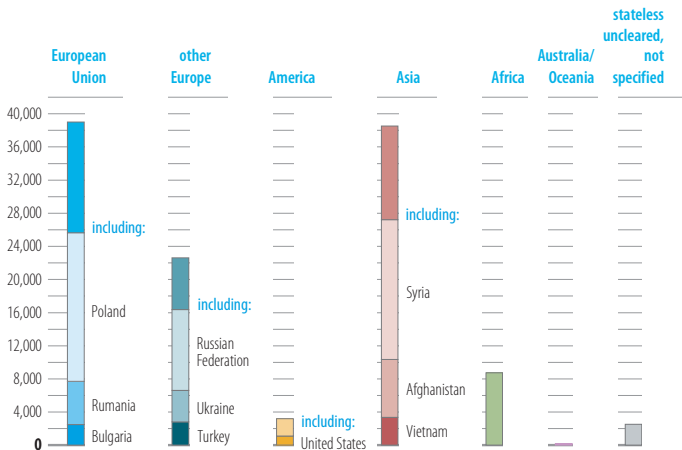

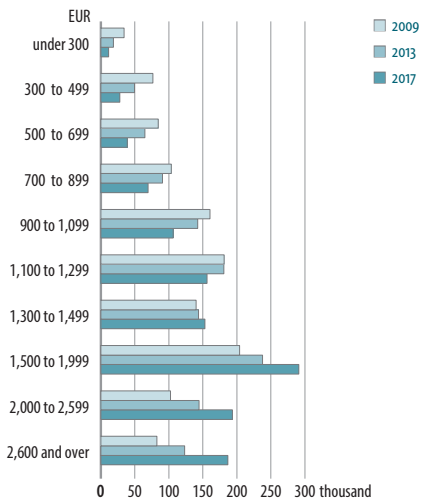

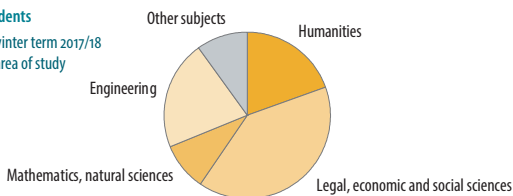

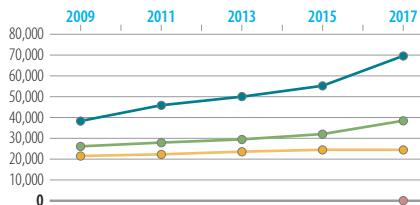

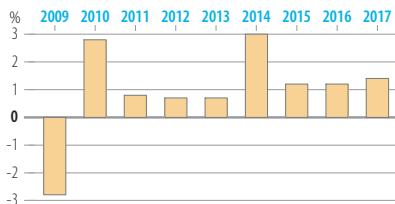

Gross domestic product in prices-adjusted rate of change in percent

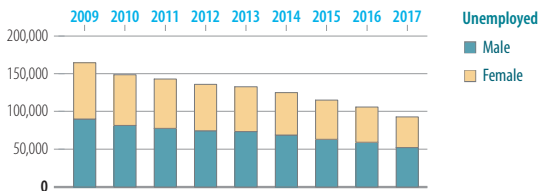

Index of consumer prices change on same month of previous year



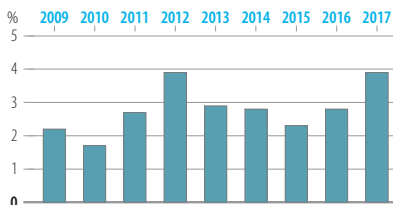
